Title Christ The King of Glory

Discussion Starter: One of the themes of Sunday's message was that Psalm 24 can be viewed as an Old Testament reference to the gospel message. Discuss and compare how Psalm 24 relates to the key points of the gospel.

Who is God? (Psalm 24:1-2, 1 Chronicles 15:25-29)

- Why do we sometimes forget who God is? Why must we be constantly reminded of who God is?
- What event helped you understand God's greatness for the first time?
- When/what was the most recent time you were reminded of God's greatness?
- What were David's circumstances at the time this Psalm was written? (1 Chronicles 15:25-29)

What does God require of us? (Psalm 24: 3-4, 6, Psalm 15)

- What four requirements does the Psalm list as requirements to be in God's presence?
- What does each represent? (hands, heart, idols, deceit)
- How does our ability to achieve these requirements relate to our understanding of the gospel message?
- What are some modern day idols that we may put ahead of God?
- Describe what portion of the gospel message is revealed in verse 6.

What does God give to us? (Psalm 24:5, Ephesians 1:7-14)

- What are the rewards of being in the presence of God?
- Describe what blessings of God David is referring to in verse 5 and who would be entitled to receive these blessings?
- Compare and contrast the similarities and differences found in the blessings described in Psalm 24: 5 and Ephesians 1:7-14.

How can God give it to us? (Psalm 24: 7-10)

- Read 1 Chronicles 15:25-29. How does this historical event relate to Psalm 24:7-10?
- What names or titles does David use to describe God in Psalm 24?
- What "battle" did Jesus win for us?
- To Israel, the ark represented the dwelling place of God. Why did David think it important to move the ark to Jerusalem? How does this apply to us today?
