• **Discussion Starter:** How do you express your position to others who don't share God's declaration of what is right and what is wrong?

The Fall of Man (Genesis 3:1-7)

- What was the general underlying theme the serpent hoped to convey to Eve during their discussion? How is this same underlying theme presented in our society today?
- What are the three areas of internal weaknesses of Eve described in Genesis 3:6 which allowed her to be exploited by Satan? How do we as Christians today protect ourselves from falling into this same trap?
- Where do you think Adam was when Eve spoke with the serpent? How does this tie into his role as spiritual leader of the family? Read Genesis 2:15-25, 3:16-17 and 1 Timothy 2:14. Discuss what additional insights are gained pertaining to the questions above from reading these passages.
- How do we know that Adam abdicated his role as spiritual leader in the family? What are some of the more common ways Christian men abdicate their role as spiritual leaders in their families today? What are the characteristics of a true spiritual leader of a family in today's world?
- What are some of the things a wife should do, and not do, to help build up her husband as the spiritual leader of the family?
- Describe the full impact to Adam and Eve of being spiritually dead after eating the forbidden fruit.
- What is the significance of Adam and Eve realizing that they were naked? What did the fig leaves represent and why were they not sufficient in God's eyes?

God's Restoration Plan for Man (Genesis 3:8-13)

- Describe in your own words what transpires in Genesis 3:8-13 and how this is part of God's restoration plan for man.
- We know that God dwells in light and that the spiritually dead do not have this light. Read Daniel 12:3, 2 Corinthians 5:1-3 and Ephesians 1:13-14. Describe how these verses relate to God's light and His restoration plan for man.
- Why do you think humans have a desperate need to be justified? How does this fit into God's restoration plan of salvation? What has to happen to the spiritually dead so that they are saved and what events need to take place for this happen?
