Discussion Starter – What new observations and understanding did you gain this week as it relates to the interaction between God's sovereignty and man's choice?

Read Genesis 29:30-35

- 1. At this point in Jacob's life, which actions and decisions has he made that are in conformance with God's promised blessing and plan for his life?
- 2. Which actions and decisions has Jacob made that are according to his own will?
- 3. What does it look like to work hard for God's kingdom in your own methods or strength?
- 4. In what ways has Jacob and his family's lives got messier as he continues to direct his own path (Proverbs 3:5-6)?
- 5. What thoughts might Leah have experienced during her early years of marriage to Jacob?
- 6. What do we see taking place in Leah's life as she continues to bear children for Jacob?

Read Genesis 30:1-24

- 7. What is the emotional and spiritual state of Rachel and Jacob at this point in the story? How are they similar? How are they different?
- 8. What do you think motivated Rachel to request Jacob go into Bilhah to bear a son for her?
- 9. How much do you think the cultural norms of the day impacted their decision?
- 10. What lessons can we learn about cultural norms that are not in alignment with God's word?
- 11. What are some of the cultural norms do we see today, even in the church, that are not in alignment with God's word?
- 12. Why do you think Rachel desired the mandrakes Ruben picked? What did she trade for them?
- 13. What does it indicate about the condition of her and her trust in the Lord's timing?
- 14. Describe how you think God remembered and listened to Rachel? What does this mean?

Read Genesis 30:25-31

- 15. How many children and how many years have passed when Jacob asked to return to Canaan?
- 16. What does Jacob's reference to "my own place" reveal about him?
- 17. Why did Laban want Jacob to remain in Haran? Why did Jacob agree? What is revealed about Jacob's priorities?
- 18. Describe how God's sovereign plan is moving forward even while Jacob's family and life is a mess.
- 19. Read Joshua 1:7-8 and Psalm 1. What has God provided as a foundation for a fruitful life? How are we to respond to it?
- 20. How were you impacted and in awe of God's sovereignty, by the Gospel of Jesus Christ being revealed in the names of Jacob's 12 sons, the twelve tribes of Israel?
