

**Discussion Starter** – What has this message revealed to you about the source of conflicts in our relationships and methods to address these conflicts?

## Read Genesis 31:1-3

- 1. Do you think Jacob's great wealth is the fullness of God's blessing? Explain
- 2. What was the status of Jacob's relationship with Laban?
- 3. Describe God's message to Jacob at this time in his life? Was this a new or old message?
  - a. Is there a message God has been speaking to you over a prolonged period that requires a response?

## Read Genesis 31:4-13

- 4. How does Jacob see his own behavior over the past 20 years? Do you think this portrayal is a full and accurate description of what has really has happened? Why or why not?
- 5. C.S. Lewis wrote: "When Sin Mutes Our Hearing, God May Speak Again In Pain". What lesson do you think God was showing Jacob about the importance of taking responsibility for our relationships?
- 6. What sin might Jacob have been harboring by not taking any personal responsibility for his contributions to the current situation? What might he have done differently to have a better relationship with God and Laban?
  - b. Have you ever had a view of your past actions that is skewed more favorably to you? How did that view affect you and your relationships?

## Read Genesis 31:14-16

- 7. What dysfunctions do you see being revealed between Laban and his daughters?
- 8. What is the general status of all the relationships within this extended family?
  - c. Are there damaged relationships in your life that are rooted in self -centered behaviors?
  - d. How can you address them in a God glorifying way?

## Read Genesis 31:17-21

- 9. What do you think Jacob is trying to avoid as he flees Haran in this passage? Why flee now?
- 10. How would you define Passive-Aggressive behavior?
- 11. When are you more likely to exhibited Passive Aggressive behavior? Describe what it feels like to be the recipient of Passive Aggressive behavior?
- 12. How does Passive Aggressive behavior affect our relationships?
- 13. What is the ultimate irony of Passive Aggressive behavior as a relationship practice?
  - *e.* As a recipient of Passive Aggressive behaviors in our relationships, what are the 2 actions mentioned in the sermon we are to avoid? What are some other examples you can think of to avoid?
  - *f.* As a recipient of Passive Aggressive behavior in a relationship, what are 2 actions mentioned in the sermon we are to adopt? What are some other examples you can think of to adopt?
