Title: Prayer and the Spirit World

Discussion Starter – 2 Corinthians 4:18 tells us there is an unseen world. Why is it important to us? How do we understand and account for the unseen world in our day-to-day life? What unseen forces are continually working in our world? What can we learn about the unseen world from Daniel's experience in this chapter?

Read Ezra 1:1-6 and Daniel 10:1-3

- 1. What event significant event does Ezra record? When does it occur?
- 2. How many Israelites respond to Cyrus' decree, (Ezra 2:64-67)?
- 3. Only a small remnant returned to rebuild the temple. What factors might have contributed to many Jews choosing to stay in Babylon?
- 4. When does Daniel 10 occur? Why do you think Daniel had not returned with Ezra's group?
- 5. We commonly think of mourning as a response to a personal loss. What was the specific cause of Daniel's strong mourning? How did he respond?
 - a. Have you ever been in mourning to the point of fasting? Did you have a specific request of God? Did you receive a specific response?
 - b. Prayer and fasting are usually linked together, how does fasting reflect the intensity of Daniel's mourning through prayer?
 - c. Is there cause for mourning over the spiritual state of our country today?

Read Daniel 10:4-9

- 6. Daniel's fast and prayer is answered with a magnificent and specific vision. Describe what Daniel saw. How did he react?
- 7. What was the reaction of the others who were with Daniel at the river?
 - d. How does God speak to you? How do you recognize His voice?
 - e. Why do you think the vision was not seen by all?

Read Daniel 10:10-17

- 8. Pastor David highlighted three keys to effective prayer: setting our hearts to understand God's will, humbling ourselves before God, and persevering in prayer. Which of these do you find most challenging, and why?
- 9. Who or what is "the Prince of Persia"? What is he doing in this passage?
- 10. What is the message that Daniel is to receive? How is this message an answer to Daniel's original mourning or concern?

Read Daniel 10:18-21

- 11. Who is the "Prince of Greece"?
- 12. Why is Michael described as "your prince"?
- 13. Describe the physical interaction Daniel has with this messenger? Read 2 Corinthians 12:9. How does Paul describe strength and weakness in the seen and unseen world?
