**Discussion Starter** – Do you have relatives, either current, or from prior generations that you would consider to be a "black sheep"? Do you consider yourself different from them? By what standard?

## Read Matthew 1:1-3

- 1. Why does Matthew begin his gospel with a genealogy of Jesus?
- 2. What is the significance of identifying Jesus as the "Son of David" and the Son of Abraham"?
- 3. Many of these names are hyper-links to backstories on the characters. How does knowledge of the Old Testament provide a more meaningful understanding of New Testament passages?

## Read Genesis 12:1-3 and Genesis 15:4-6

- 4. What qualities did Abraham possess when God called him? What purpose did God plan to fulfill in Abraham?
- 5. How many years passed between Genesis 12 and Genesis 15? Had Abraham faithfully trusted God during those years?
  - a. What promises has God given to you? Have you always responded faithfully to His promises? Has God been faithful?
  - b. Why does God keep His promises to you, Abraham, or any individual?
- 6. What stories of dis-loyalty, deception, lying, manipulation, and sin does the bible record in the lives of the Jewish fathers listed in Matthew 1:1-3?

## Read Matthew 1:4-17

- 7. What 4 women are listed in this genealogy, (prior to Mary)? What is unusual about their being identified in this genealogy of the Messiah?
- 8. What promise does God make to David in 2 Samuel 7:12-16?
- 9. What is the general testimony of the lives of the Kings listed after David? How did they lead their nation? How was their walk with god?
- 10. Define "Grace" in your own words? How is it used in the Bible?
- 11. Why did God's perfect Savior not descend from a righteous ancestry, (at least marginally better than average)?
  - c. What does the listing of Jesus' ancestry reveal about the depravity of man and the grace of God?
  - d. How does our ancestry and immediately family affect God's gift of grace to us? How does it affect our acceptance of His grace?
  - e. Have you ever traded the gracious gift of a Godly life for a bowl of beans, (as Esau)?
  - f. How can we best respond to God's grace?
