Passage: Galatians 3:1-16, Galatians 5:16-26

Title: How to Lead a Spirit Led Life

**Discussion Starter** – The term "Spirit Led Life" is a church term that means different things to different people. What might your un-churched neighbor assume about you if you shared your desire to walk in the spirit? What other misunderstandings possibly accompany this language within the larger, worldwide community of believers?

## Read Galatians 5:16-26

- 1. How does Paul describe the Spirit/flesh conflict in these verses in a way that is understandable and clear?
- 2. How do Paul's definitions of the spirit/flesh conflict described in this section provide an explanation of the source of evil in the world? (read James 4:1)
- 3. Notice the different descriptors used with spirit and flesh, (walk/fulfill, led/under, works of the flesh/fruit of the Spirit). What do these terms reveal about how we interact differently with flesh and spirit?
- 4. What two options do we have for going through life?
- 5. What actions on our part lead to enslavement? What freedom does Jesus offer us? (John 8:34-36 and Romans 8:13)

## Read Galatians 2:21-3:9

- 6. What specific questions does Paul ask the Galatians in these verses? What is the obvious conclusion?
  - a. What role do deeds and lifestyle play when measuring your relationship with Jesus?
- 7. What is the difference between "works of the Law" and "hearing of faith" in verse 5? Why does it matter?
- 8. What was Abraham's act of faith? What was he responding to? What were the results? (Genesis 15:1-6)
  - b. What was your act of faith? How is your initial act of faith a template for your walk in faith today? (What 4 points were given in the message about living a Spirit led life?)
- 9. What signs and attitudes are common in a life lived in self (flesh) reliance?
  - c. How do you respond when these signs begin to creep into your life?
  - d. Is your response motivated from faith or obedience?

## Read Galatians 3:10-14

- 10. Why does Paul say we can never escape the consequences of sin by adhering to the works of the law?
- 11. Why did Jesus identify fully with humanity and man's experience, from birth, through humiliation, to death?
  - e. Describe what is included in "the promise of the Spirit" that we can receive through faith. (verse 14)
