

**Series:** Seasons in the Psalms, Reflections on God and the Significance of the Soul

Passage: Psalm 105

**Title:** Rejoicing in God's Faithfulness **Speaker:** Pastor JC Cooper 10/19/2025

**Discussion Starter** – What long term promises has God given to you? What "down payments" or incremental fulfillments have you seen? What is your story, (either personally, as a family, or as a community of believers), that you can recount, similarly to David, that confirms God has been faithful in the past and can be trusted to complete His good work in you?

## Read Psalm 105:1-15, (1 Chronicles 15:8-22)

- 1. What event marks the occasion for this Psalm? How significant is the event to David and the nation?
- 2. What action words, (verbs) does David implore the people to undertake in the first 6 verses?
  - a. How does proactive engagement with God and declaration of His works build our faith in God's promises?
- 3. What promise does David recall that is celebrated in this psalm (verses 7-15)? When was the promise given? (Genesis 12, 15, and 17)? How is it fulfilled (even partially) at this time?
  - b. What promises has God given to you that are yet future? What intermediate confirmations have you received that confirm and strengthen your faith in His promises?

## Read Psalm 105:16-36

- 4. How is God's faithfulness to His promise described in verses 16-25?
  - c. Where can you find confidence God's faithfulness to His plan during times when He is seemingly absent?
- 5. After 400 years of silence, what steps does God take to free His people and prove Himself faithful to His promise?

## Read Psalm 105:37-45

- 6. How does God lavishly fulfill His promise to His children as described in these verses? How have you experienced God's generous blessings?
- 7. How does recalling God's past deeds encourage us to confidence in our present situations?
  - d. How does knowing God's past faithfulness and generosity help us to consistently obey His statutes? How does each challenge present it's own challenge, regardless of God's past faithfulness?
