



**Series:** Seasons in the Psalms, Reflections on God and the Significance of the Soul

**Passage:** Psalm 110

**Title:** King and Priest, The Millennial Reign of Jesus

**Discussion Starter** – What two roles or offices are assigned to Jesus in this psalm? Which one is He currently exercising? Which one is still future? How are they different, how are they similar?

**Read Psalm 110: 1-3**

1. Who is talking in this verse? Who is the Lord who is speaking? Who is the Lord who is being spoken to?
2. How does Jesus answer this question in Matthew 22: 41-45?
3. What does it mean that Jesus is seated at God’s right hand? What priestly task is He currently performing? (Hebrews 7:25)
4. When was this invitation given? (Read Acts 2:29-36)
5. What is the significance of the use of the word “till” in verse 1? What is the event that triggers this change? What will change when this event occurs?
6. How is Jesus’ reign described? Where will this rule be centered? Who will assist in the enforcement of His authority?
  - a. How are you currently being built up to be a volunteer in Jesus’ rule over His enemies in the day of His power? How does your life reflect the authority of Christ to others?
  - b. What work can we already be engaged in that builds His kingdom, even though we do not yet see this “day of His power”?
7. How do we know this “day of power” is still future, (Hebrews 2:8b-9)?
  - c. How do these verses help your understanding of God’s promise in Genesis 3:15?

**Read Psalm 110:4-7**

8. What does the name, “Melchizedek” mean? What 2 offices did he hold? How does his biblical portrait identify him with Jesus? (Read Hebrews 7:1-3)
9. How does the order of Melchizedek differ from the order of Aaron as a priesthood? (Hebrews 7:22-25)
10. How is Jesus’ iron rule over His enemies described? What is His hope for His enemies? (2 Peter 3:9)
  - d. How does understanding of this psalm motivate you to evangelize?
  - e. What in this psalm expands your understanding of the gospel, (God’s good news of restoration and rescue) and the heart of people who will resist to the point of death?
